Float Fly-Fishing Trips

We offer single day and multi-day float fly fishing trips on southwest Montana's finest rivers. ABO is based out of Big Timber with fishing partners based in Livingston and Bozeman, giving us the ability to cover the whole region. We typically focus on the Yellowstone, Boulder, Madison and Gallatin rivers, with the ability for multi-day trips on the Missouri, Big Horn and Big Hole upon request. Boats accommodate two fishermen and a guide.

A day on the river starts early in the morning with transportation included to and from the river. You will fish with comfort and ease from the best drift boats on the market. Fishing from a drift boat offers the angler several advantages, including the ability to present their fly correctly without difficult wading conditions or impeded back casts. Floating gives fishermen the chance to cover more water, see lots of scenery and have new fishing opportunities with every cast.

Our guides like to fish the river in accordance to the conditions, hatches and fish activity of each day. Our goal is to customize your trip to be the best possible. If the fishing is getting hot early or late we try to adjust river time for your best fishing opportunity. This is not an 8-5 job for us. It's about fishing and sharing the incredible opportunities Montana has to offer.

Non-anglers are encouraged to join in the adventure. Whether the non-anglers' preference is to float and read or to enjoy the sights, sounds, and fresh air of the Big Sky Country, our



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comfortable drift boats will provide them a relaxing day on one of Montana's pristine rivers.

Float/Wade Fly Fishing Trips

- ✓ **You will need to make hotel reservations for your stay in either Bozeman or Big Timber, depending on your fishing destination.** You will be picked up early in the morning from your hotel on the day of your float trip and returned to your hotel in the late afternoon or early evening.
- ✓ Hotel information is listed on the next page. **Please check in with ABO (406-579-3866) upon arrival to let us know you have arrived. Leave your cell phone number so we can call and confirm the morning departure time.**
- ✓ **GUESTS DRIVING:** Bozeman is located off Interstate 90. Big Timber is located off Interstate 90 between Bozeman and Billings. Bozeman to Big Timber is 60 miles, driving time 1 hour. Billings to Big Timber is 90 miles, driving time 1½ hours.
- ✓ **GUESTS FLYING:** Plan to fly into the **Bozeman International Airport (BZN)** the day before your trip begins. The following airlines service Bozeman:

ABO lodge and ranch house are located on Cross Triangle Ranch, a working cattle and sheep ranch, in Big Timber, MT. We offer affordable, comfortable lodging from which to base your explorations in Big Sky Country. The headquarters for Absaroka Beartooth Outfitters is also located on the ranch and offers lodge and house guests a variety of fun activities to fill their days. Activities include horseback riding, fishing, floating on the Yellowstone river and ATV tours on our working cattle and sheep ranch. If you want to help feed the sheep or move a few cows, we can always use an extra hand. Helicopter rides to access a day in the mountains are also available. You choose, we provide the experience. Families welcomed!

ABO Lodge - provides comfortable rooms with vistas of the Crazy Mountains, green grasslands for horse and cattle grazing and a pond. There are five rooms in the lodge, Two of the rooms have queen beds & one extra-long twin, two rooms have two extra-long twin beds and one room has one queen bed. The rooms share two full baths with another full bath in the main lodge. There is a washer and dryer conveniently located near the rooms for guests. A microwave and refrigerator are available for guest use in the main lodge. The main lodge is a large open concept room with a sitting and TV area, dining area and kitchen. The main lodge kitchen is not available for guests to cook but a cook is available upon request for an extra charge.

FLOAT/WADE FLY FISHING TRIPS

Recommended gear for float fishing trips

Weather may vary during the summer months from very warm to very cold, so be prepared for everything. We recommend the layered system of dressing.

- wading shoes/sandals (On warm summer days wet wading is preferable on both float and wade fishing trips) ***
- waders and wading boots ***
- non-cotton socks
- warm and cold weather clothing (Montana weather is always changing)
- rain gear
- windbreaker
- sunscreen
- polarized sunglasses
- sun and rain hat
- 5-6 wt. rod
- 0-6x tippet
- 3x, 4x, 5x 9ft. leaders
- sinking line for streamer fishing
- secret flies (We are always looking for new ties.)

OPTIONAL OR LUXURY ITEMS

- Binoculars
- GPS, Range Finder, Cell phone
- Camera/extra film
- Spirited beverage if desired

***** We ask that all footwear worn into Montana's waters has non-slip rubber bottoms, NO FELT. This is due to the potential for aquatic invasives (non-native invasive species). Cleaning the bottom of your rubber sole sandals, waders and wading boots with 409 is an excellent way to protect against spreading non-native invasive species.**
